



City & Guilds Level 2 Bricklaying (6705-23)

Who is it suitable for?

Learners who hold a previous qualification, such as the Level 1 Diploma in Bricklaying, or have equivalent experience working with bricks and mortar. You will be seeking to consolidate your skills and knowledge of the trade to progress to further learning and specialisation in bricklaying.



What are the aims of the course?

You will learn practical skills specific to bricklaying, including building solid walling, isolated and attached piers; interpreting working drawings to set out masonry structures, and constructing cavity walling forming masonry structures.

What areas are covered in this course?

You will learn about health, safety and environmental issues faced on construction sites, and how to communicate with others on the job. You will also learn practical skills specific to bricklaying, such as setting out, bricklaying, block laying and building cavity walling. Will be assessed for the following units:

- Joint Masonry and Masonry Cladding
- Solid Walling, Isolated & Attached Piers
- Interpretating working drawings to set out masonry structures
- Drawings and Diagrams



The assessment will involve end of unit practical and knowledge tests and creation of a portfolio of work.

What will I be able to go on to after I've completed the course?

Either as part of an apprenticeship, or as a standalone qualification. You may progress on to the following qualifications:
