ARMY DAY - 9th November 2023

On Thursday 9th November the Army came to KITE College for an interactive roadshow. 13 troop members came and along with 2 interactive stands they also bought along a RWMIK vehicle which learners were allowed to sit in/on and get an idea of what it would be like to be one of the troops!

The day started with a talk about all the different careers in the Army, how to apply and what life is like for a soldier in the various roles they have. Learners were then able to visit the interactive stands where they were able to have hands on interaction with specialist military equipment, including weapons and kit. Serving soldiers gave learners an insight into their roles and experiences within the army and answered any questions. Some of our learners asked about specific roles such as the Military Police and the SAS.

The day was all about building confidence, developing personal resilience, and encouraging teamwork. Learners asked questions, tried on the kit and were able to be hands on with all the weapons. They all thoroughly enjoyed and made the most of this opportunity.

It was a really great day and our learners learnt that the army is not just about being a soldier but that there are numerous other trades and jobs they could go into, something which was a real eye opener.

We also experienced a visit from the Army career team who spent the majority of the day sharing information and demonstrating the mechanical side of the Land-rover that had accompanied the soldiers.

In practical lessons we have been creating and eating different foods from around the world including cooking up a storm with our Zemiakove Placky, a dish inspired by one of our students.

Zemiakove Placky

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 3 lb white potatoes
- 4 cloves garlic, crushed
- 3 eggs
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons marjoram

Salt

Pepper

Vegetable oil for frying

<u>Instructions</u>

- Peel the potatoes and grate them immediately with a medium grater.
- Pour them into a strainer and let them drain well by placing a weight on top.
- In a large salad bowl, combine the grated potatoes with garlic, eggs, flour, salt, pepper and marjoram. Mix well.
- Divide the dough into 15 balls of the same size and flatten them.

- Cook them in a hot oil bath, gently turning them occasionally, until golden brown.
- Place them on a plate lined with paper towel and serve immediately after frying.






There is a more positive engagement with Maths lessons and most students are working really hard towards their qualifications.
