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Careers

The last two terms have been a busy and exciting time for the Careers department at KITE College, with a variety of guest speakers and events designed to inspire and inform our learners about their future career options.

We kicked off with the fantastic Kamal Ellis-Hyman from 'Aim a Little Higher', who delivered engaging assemblies and workshops aimed at helping our learners improve their academic attainment, understand potential career paths, and motivate them to aspire for more - no matter their circumstances. The impactful discussions made a significant difference, and it was wonderful to witness how motivated and inspired our learners felt as Kamal spoke about changing mindsets and genuinely believing in their abilities. The assemblies were thought-provoking and uplifting, leaving learners feeling empowered and excited about their future endeavours.

Next, Liz Nevitt from Dedicate Recruitment ran a CV writing workshop with our learners. She provided valuable tips and advice on how to stand out when applying for jobs, offering practical insights that will undoubtedly help our learners as they begin their job search.

During Apprenticeship Week, we were fortunate to host Michelle Clarke from CXK, who delivered informative assemblies and workshops about apprenticeships, focusing on the Apprenticeship Support and Knowledge for Schools and Colleges (ASK) programme. Michelle also ran a practical workshop, giving learners the chance to participate in mock interviews with each other and staff, helping them build confidence for future job applications.

We also welcomed Sergeant Paul Garvie from the British Army, who delivered an insightful assembly detailing the various career pathways and job opportunities available within the Army, as well as how to apply. His session sparked interest in some learners who may not have previously considered a career in the Armed Forces.

Lastly, Christine Murrells our regular Careers Advisor from CXK visited to provide group and 1-1 careers advice workshops, helping our learners explore their options and decide what they might like to do once they leave KITE College. Christine's guidance is invaluable in helping learners think about their next steps and make more informed decisions about their future. Alongside all our guests Rachael Cretten the Careers Leader delivered careers workshops to all learners particularly focusing on apprenticeships and busting all the myths surrounding them! We are incredibly grateful to all of our guest speakers for sharing their expertise and offering such a wealth of knowledge and inspiration to our learners. Preparation for Learning

Preparation for Learning Year 1 learners celebrated Chinese New Year as part of their cultural diversity curriculum. It is the year of the wood snake.

- · Refined their interview techniques.

- \cdot Acquired valuable work experience both within the College and at Heather House café.

These accomplishments have collectively boosted their readiness for employment.

Personal Development workshops

It's been an exciting time at KITE College, with numerous visitors coming in to educate and engage our learners.

James from the Metro charity has been offering valuable advice on contraception and sexual health matters, including consent, STI testing, and other related topics. He also provides a selection of contraception options for everyone. Additionally, Marie Sacre and Sally Reed are available at the College to offer contraception, support, and advice.

As part of our Personal Development curriculum, we have been focusing on Alcohol Awareness. To enhance this, we welcomed speakers from Alcoholics Anonymous to share their personal experiences with alcohol. Four AA members visited KITE College to recount their journeys with alcohol addiction and the support they received to overcome it. They discussed the dangers and impacts of alcohol misuse and how we can support ourselves and others who may be struggling. These talks were incredibly emotive and genuine, raising awareness about alcohol issues and the importance of seeking help.

PC Matt Ongley from the Child Centred Policing Team hosted a lunchtime drop-in clinic on first aid. Many learners had the opportunity to practice CPR and treat injuries. This ongoing project aims to foster a friendly relationship between local police and our learners, breaking down barriers and ensuring mutual safety.










Functional Skills


Maths

Over the past 2 terms, we have had 6 learners achieve their target qualifications in maths.

All learners who resat exams, scored higher than they did previously, and end of term assessment results are improved over their start of term scores.

Subjects covered Measurements and Geometry.





English

This term the main focus within our English lessons has been Speaking and Listening. The learners have been creating a PowerPoint presentation on a topic they know very well and researching an academic topic. We have had a myriad of topics in the presentations from gaming to socialism and fishing. We have also had another set of very positive exam results for our learners which we look forward to telling all the exam takers when we see them next in college.







ICT

Our computing learners have been busy applying their skills in real-world scenarios! They've been using the 3D printer to bring their creative designs to life, working from detailed design briefs to produce functional and innovative models. Along the way, they've honed their problem-solving abilities by troubleshooting non-working computers, diagnosing hardware and software issues, and finding effective solutions. This hands-on experience has strengthened their technical knowledge and critical thinking, preparing them for future challenges in the tech world. We're proud of their dedication and look forward to seeing more exciting projects!

Hair and Beauty

This term, the Hair and Beauty learners have showcased their creativity and skills through a variety of exciting projects. They successfully completed their spring hairstyles, bringing vibrant and fresh looks to life. As part of Unit 112, "Create a Hair and Beauty Image," learners had the opportunity to choose between a photoshoot, competition, or presentation. Many opted for a photoshoot, with one standout creation inspired by the theme of a springtime picnic. The learners expertly styled their models, capturing the essence of the season with soft, natural looks that perfectly complemented the picnic atmosphere.









Construction

This term, the Multiskills learners have been learning about electrical installations. We have practiced wiring a 13amp plug and a ceiling rose and are now moving on to how a ring main works. The carpentry group have been working on more complex assignments with different depth cuts, plane angles and mortices needed on each part. The brick learners are now working with blocks as well a bricks and are adjusting to how the materials interact with each other and the mortar mix.

All of the learners have been using recycled materials to make a range of things including some birdboxes for Murston Heart, using scrap copper pipe to make lamps and candelabras and the scrap wood for gifts.









Motor Vehicle

The automotive pathway has enjoyed a great start to the year. Our new learners have settled in well and are building their practical skills, gaining familiarity with different tools and working on a range of vehicles. They have all removed, inspected and replaced cylinder heads, suspension struts, exhaust systems and brake pads and discs.

The returning cohort have come back ready to learn and have been challenged with tasks including inspecting, testing and evaluating components, using diagnostic equipment, installing and repairing the wiring looms, bleeding the brake system, and completing pre-MOT inspections on our 2 new vehicles. We are always looking for end of life cars to give the learners a more realistic learning experience.

Our new member of the team Mark, who has over 35-year experience in the motor trade, working as a manager at Halfords and having his own garage, has made a massive positive contribution bringing an extra perspective and experiences to our learners.

We have just been given the opportunity for our learners to gain a Halfords trade card which will help them on the journey into work and these will be available in the next few weeks.

Planned trips and visits- We are preparing to offer a visit to the Science Museum which displays the history of the Motor Car and links to modern Electric Vehicle, Hybrid and future technologies. We hope all our cohort will sign up to this and enjoy the day visiting London, more information to follow!






Enrichment


Special Events


